

Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo Celebrating 35 years of Black Cowboys and Cowgirls

The Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo started 35 years ago as a result of a vision of Lu Vason, founder of BPIR. Lu believed that the African American Cowboy and Cowgirl had a story that needed to be told. He did his researched and reached out to many before deciding to create an all-Black rodeo association, which was no small feat. It was against all odds that BPIR was birthed therefore we should all celebrate Lu Vason's vision and creation.



As we celebrate this legacy, I want to thank every cowboy and cowgirl for being part of BPIR and for participating. I know you have choices. Every participate has made a difference in someone's life and your stories and faces have left thousands of foot prints in the minds and hearts of people all over the world. You are heroes and we will continue to tell your story.

To begin the 35th year, our first rodeo was the MLK Rodeo on January 21st in Denver, CO, which was a great start to the season. We had slack on Monday morning and incredible show performance that night as we celebrated Martin Luther King birthday.



The crowd filled the Denver Coliseum as the show opened with fireworks and the Happy Birthday song to MLK. The crowd was excited and ready but before we started the action, we felt it appropriate to recognized Sedgwick Haynes, whose last BPIR rodeo was the MLK rodeo in 2018 before he passed in February. Sedgwick was a critical part of BPIR and we honed his memory and legacy. He is truly missed.

It was time to start the rodeo, which started with the Bull Dogging. With the first rodeo of the season, Drew Madden was not going to be denied. He walked away with a 1st place win with a 4.7 time. He was followed closely by Denell Henderson with a 5.3 and Justin Richard with a 5.7.



Moving to the Calf Roping event, the evening was quite challenging. But for the BPIR cowboys nothing is too challenging and Jeremy Burkhalter proved that by taking the 1st place win with a 9.9. It seem that Denell was totally on his game because he also participated in this event and walked away with 2nd place with a 10.1. The next winners were all very closed in their times with Richard Coleman at 11.5, JD Freeman at 11.8, Malik Gatson with a 12 followed by TJ Hewitt with a 12.2.



In the Bareback, Lamontre was determined to start the year with a win. He took 1st place with a 72 score and was followed by Harold Miller and Patrick Liddell with 69 and 66 respectively.



The ladies were waiting patiently for their time. It was time for Ladies Steer Undercorating, which was another challenging event. Did I say this event was challenging? The steers were ducking and shooting out of the gate providing many frustrations. The steers were not cooperating at all but the ladies didn't give up. They tried and tried until they pulled the tape off. Based on pure determination, Denesha won 1st place with a 23.3. She was followed by her mother, Denise Tyus with a 23.7. Taking 3rd place was Valynia Brooks with a 27.3 and Reneisha Harden with 29.19.



After that we took a break for the Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund to announce the 2019 Scholarship recipients. The Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund is committed to awarding over \$17,000 in scholarships, fee grants and book stipends in 2019.



Several Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarships were awarded, which include 2 National Scholarships The Lu Vason Founders Scholarships recipients were DeQuan Laskey and Andrew Madden and each will receive \$1500.00.

DeQuan attends Jones High School in Jones Oklahoma. He will graduate in May 2019. DeQuan will be attending college at Northwestern Oklahoma State University or Connors State College. He will major in Agricultural Business Operations.

DeQuan plays football, basketball and works with under privilege foster kids. He loves rodeo and competes within the Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo.

Andrew is currently attending Texas A & M University seeking a Bachelors in Agricultural Sciences. He is expected to graduate in 2022. Andrew is a member of the Texas A&M Student Athletic Advisor Council and serves as a Men's Rodeo Team Representative. Andrew also a member of the Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo Association.

The Denver Regional Scholarship Recipient winner was Wilber "Trey" Redwine and will receive \$1,000.00.

Trey is a student at Denver School of Science and Technology in Stapleton. He graduates in May 2019. He plans on attending the University of Colorado or Colorado State University in the Fall. Trey will major in

Business and Finance. When asked about the impact of the BPIR in the Denver Region he stated: One of the greatest things I personally love about the Rodeo is their commitment to recognizing diversity and exposing youth to African American Cowboys and Cowgirls.

In partnership with Jack & Jill of America Denver Chapter, the Bill Pickett Memorial Scholarship Fund awarded \$500 to 2018 Beau- Dillion Andrews.

After the scholarship and being entertained by the Westernaires, a Colorado based non-profit organization located in Golden, Colorado, comprised of over 1,000 dedicated young people, aged 9 to 19 using their talents and skills in the best traditions of the West. They were incredible as they rode sideways, backwards, jumping through fire hoops and all.

Well timing was moving fact and it was time for the Ladies Barrel Racing event. Colorado's own Savannah Roberts, intent on winning in her home state did just that. She took 1st place with a time of 16.103 but another Coloradoan, Mikala Nealy was close behind with a 16.194 for a 2nd place win. 3rd place was won by Carolyn Carter with a 16.8 who was followed by Jay Carter with an 18.12. Denesha Henderson and Raemia Clemons followed with the 5th and 6th place wins. The ladies had the crowds cheering them on.

The excitement was increasing as they announced the Junior Barrel Racing event. These youngsters were ready to go. The came out barreling and the crowd was up on their feet. Being totally committed, the juniors placed some impressive scores. Sadie Jackson, from Colorado took 1st with a score of 16.25. She was followed by Savannah Roberts with a 16.62. Yes, the same Savannah Roberts who took 1st in the Ladies Barrel Racing event. She is making her footprint in the rodeo world. 3rd place in the Junior Barrel Racing event was won by Kortnee Solomon with a 21.46.

After all that excitement, it was time for the bulls versus man. I am happy to report that man won over the bulls. The 1st place was won by Anthony Lyons with a 74. Justin Rickard, took 2nd place with a 72 and was followed by Justin Richard, who Bull Dog's also with a 69.

After an entertaining evening, we said goodnight to a great audience by sharing that in our Western rodeo world we respect and love everyone, no matter their race, religion or ethnicity. It is all about LOVE.

Our first show for 2019 was over and I thank everyone who made the trip to Denver and continue to support the BPIR.

It is time for us to prepare for Memphis, TN., where the RFKS rodeo is on Friday morning, April 5th and the main show on Saturday night at 7:00pm. Get ready and let's show Memphis how we do it "Kickin in the Dirt".

BPIR Rules & Regulations 2019

As stated above, in 2019 BPIR will operate using its own rules as outlined in the 2019 BPIR Rule book. The book will be available online and a hard copy provided to all BPIR members. In 2019, we will add a new Icon under the Rule Book section called **RULE CHANGES** to captures any rule changes made to the Rule Book as an easy reference for you.

There are a number of changes and I am highlighting a few that you should be aware of. The changes below are not an inclusive list but just a few major changes:

- BPIR will continue to abide by its own rules for 2019.
- Membership cards must be purchased or renewed PRIOR to competing in any sanctioned rodeo for the rodeo points to count towards 2019 standings. New membership cards will remain at \$80 for 2019 and renewal membership cards at \$70 (2018 members ONLY). 2018 Rodeo Champions are exempt from paying membership fees. Seniors - 50 years and above must purchase a membership the 1st year for \$30. All memberships are free afterwards as long as there has been 5 years of consecutive participation.
- All members and permit holders must be paid 2 hour before rodeo time. If not paid, you will not be allowed on the books once closed. Please read carefully because there will be no exceptions for members or non-members. Once the books are closed, they are closed for everyone.

After the publication of the 2019 book, any and all updates will be posted to the website. You can find the updates under Contestants/Rule Book. There will be a Icon named Rules Update.

QUALIFYING FOR THE 2019 BILL PICKETT INVITATIONAL FINALS RODEO - TOP 10

TOP 10: To qualify for the BPIR Finals a participant must compete in one (1) more than 1/2 of BPIR rodeos including sanction rodeos in each event, prior to the BPIR Finals. If a rodeo event is not included in all rodeos, the 1 more than 1/2 will be based on the number of rodeos the event was included in. The one (1) more than 1/2 creates an interesting dilemma when there are an odd number of rodeos. To clarify, if there are nine (9) rodeos, the participant would have to compete in a total of six (6) rodeos. **If a rodeo event is not included in all rodeos, the 1 more than 1/2 will be based on the number of rodeos the event was included.**

The top 10 point (money) leaders who are BPIR members and have met the rodeo requirement rule of (one more than half) will qualify for BPIR Championship Rodeo. The top 10 leaders in each event will be invited to compete in the finals for that event. **PLEASE NOTE: The BPIR Finals does not count as a qualifying rodeo.**

If a BPIR member competes in two or more events during the current rodeo year, they qualify for All-Around Cowboy/Cowgirl competition. However, mere qualification alone does not guarantee a spot in both events at the finals. For example, if a contestant is **NOT** one of the top 10 leaders in one of their events, they may not be a BPIR finalist in that event merely because they competed in a second event and/or won money in that event. Monies won in each event will count towards All-Around Cowboy/Cowgirl points.

If a contestant is invited to compete at the BPIR finals as an alternate and **DID NOT** compete in one more than half of the rodeos, he/she WILL NOT be eligible for any year-end awards, however anyone who competes will be eligible for Bill Pickett Invitational Rodeo Finals awards. i.e. average event winners. **To be eligible for a BPIR Championship title, you must compete in the BPIR Finals.**

Please note, Contestants will be grouped according to how they qualify to compete at the finals as follows:

- ONLY Group 1 (Qualified Rodeo requirements & earned money) will be eligible for Year End Awards and finals entry fee will be paid by BPIR.
- Group 2 (Qualified Rodeo requirements & No Money) will be considered Alternates
- Group 3 (Money & Not Enough Qualified Rodeos) will be considered Alternates.

BPIR Rules & Regulations 2019 continued

CO-APPROVED/ SANCTIONED RODEOS:

Co-Approved Rodeos may require you to PURCHASE A PERMIT OR CARD in order to compete. You MUST be a BPIR Member BEFORE competing in a Co-Approved/Sanction Rodeo in order for your points to count for BPIR association. NO EXCEPTIONS!!!!

BPIR FINALS JACKETS:

All contestants competing at the finals will receive a BPIR Finals jacket.

RFKS ENTRY RULE:

All timed events (CR, SW, LSU) are last to ENTER first to go EXCEPT Ladies Barrel Racing. All CONTESTANTS and STAFF must check in with Secretary on day of event unless pre-entered via online or mail entry.

STALLS and RV HOOK-UPS:

Contestants, Staff and Specialty Acts are responsible for paying their Stall, RV's and Electrical Hook-up Charges in each market. If anyone leaves a market without paying their charges, they will not be allowed to enter another BPIR rodeo until all charges are paid.

RELAY RACE RULE: All Relay teams MUST register with the secretary. If there are any changes to your team members, you must notify the secretary before competing in order to avoid disqualification. If there is (7) Relay Teams or Less, Each team will run both days (SAT & SUN) and both Performances (1:30 & 7:30) and paid on an AVERAGE of the combined times. If there is (8) or more teams, the relay race will be ONE RUN based on FASTEST TIMES. The Teams will be divided based on ODD Numbers running on (SATURDAY or 1:30) Performance and EVEN numbers running on (Sunday or 7:30PM Performance). In the event the Rodeo only has one performance, the odd numbers will compete in the (pre-show or 1st session) and the even numbers will compete in the (2nd session). The Relay pattern will be stakes prior to competing in a one run competition.

* Each contestant will be allowed to compete on TWO TEAMS ONLY. If a person is found to have competed on more the TWO TEAMS, ALL the teams will be DISQUALIFIED. ALL THREE TEAMS will be disqualified and NO MONEY will be REFUNDED.

Relay Race operates as follows:

1. THE START OF THE RELAY WILL BEGIN AT THE FIRST BARREL AND THE FINISH WILL BE AT THE FIRST BARREL (reason: the majority of the relay racers will be accustom to starting at the 1st barrel and stopping at the 4th. The relay racers are generally the same group of people each year.
2. THE PASSING OF THE BATON WILL OCCUR BETWEEN THE 4TH AND 1ST BARREL ONLY (i.e. the pass can't happen at the 4th, nor can it .The passing of the baton will occur between the 4th and 1st barrel only (i.e. The pass can't happen at the 4th, nor can it happen at the 1st, it must be between the barrels).
3. You have to be ready to enter the arena when your team is called, if not, you will be disqualified and will forfeit your entry fee.
4. You can encourage your horse to run; however, the designated relay baton is all that you can pass between riders.
5. The barrel will be staked at the very beginning and will remain the same for the duration of the race for both performances.

LADIES BARREL RACING:

The ladies barrel race will be ONE run with 16 or more called in and paid contestants.

Two runs with (1-15) called in and paid entries.

BAREBACK ADDED MONEY:

If there is 4 or more paid contestants, BPIR will add 100% of Added Money. If there is (1-3) PAID contestants, BPIR will add 50% of Added Money. This rule applies only to the Main performances ONLY.

TIMED EVENTS:

For timed events, the contestant has 3 attempts to set their animal to contest their stock. After the 3rd attempt, the Judge will allow 45 seconds before your stock is released.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR QUALIFICATIONS:

To be eligible for Rookie of the year, a participant must compete in one (1) more than 1/2 of BPIR rodeos including sanctioned rodeos in an event. The one (1) more than 1/2 creates an interesting dilemma when there are an odd number of rodeos. To clarify, if there are nine (9) rodeos, the participant would have to compete in a total of five (5) rodeos (Example: ½ of nine is 4.5 and one (1) more would be 5.5; since one cannot compete in half a rodeo, the number required to compete in would be rounded up to the next whole number). A Rookie contender must have a membership card and have not participated previously as a BPIR member.

BPIR Rules & Regulations 2019 continued

If there is no qualified score or time in an event, the ground money will not count toward points. BPIR Membership balance will be deducted from Ground Money in all events.

BULL RIDING PAY OUTS:

Bull Riding will be paid on each go round per rodeo. BPIR Finals will pay each go round and an average

COGGINS REQUIRE:

Current Coggins Papers (No Exceptions)

BOOKS CLOSE:

*** All Contestants Must Be Present In The Arena And Entry Fees Paid (2) Hours Before The Performance.**

BPIR PERMITS:

- Non-members must purchase permits and the permit fee must be paid at the time the entry fee is paid.
- Permit holders (Non-Members) must call in their entry. All entries of permit holders must be paid no later than (2) hours before the rodeo performance. If entry is not paid, contestant will be withdrawn from the event and fined if contestant does not call secretary and withdrawn 24 hours before rodeo.
- If a Permit Holder earns money during a rodeo, and elects to purchase a membership during payoff the cost of membership is eighty dollars (\$80.00) less the twenty dollars (\$20.00) permit fee or sixty dollars (\$60.00). Points (earnings) won under a permit will not count towards the standings. Points earned under the newly purchased membership will begin to count at the next BPIR or Approved Sanctioned Rodeo with money earned.
- Permit holders will not be eligible for any prizes other than money earned at BPIR rodeos in which permit holder participates. Permit holders will not be eligible for finals.
